Monitoring and Performing Inspections

Course Description:

Commission Regulation (EU) No 139/2014 of 12 February 2014: ADR.OPS.B.015 **Monitoring and inspection of movement area** and related facilities laying down that the aerodrome operator shall monitor the condition of the movement area and the operational status of related facilities and report on matters of operational significance, whether of a temporary or permanent nature, to the relevant air traffic services providers and aeronautical information services providers.

Furthermore EASA's Acceptable Means of Compliance (AMC) and Guidance Material (GM) state that the operator should establish a monitoring and inspection program and shall carry out regular inspections of the movement area and its related facilities.
